Simple way to add an Aux Music Input on C6's with Sat Units

I you happen to own a C6 without an AUX or USB input, like my 2008, then here is a simple way I found to add an AUX jack to allow you to play your digital music player (or Smartphone) device through your car stereo system.

I ran across this <u>website</u>, operated by Ray Kawal, and read through a number of solutions that Ray had found to help me move my 2008 forward into the digital music revolution. Besides audio solutions, Ray has also managed to do a few other C6 mods you might find interesting.





For my purposes, I was interested in simply adding an <u>auxiliary jack</u> that would allow me to utilize my smartphone to play my digital music collection in my car. Looking over the instruction showed the installation to be relatively simple using standards tools, but it does require you to remove the center console to best mount the port in a convenient yet hidden location. Ray provides you with pictures to help along the way.

In short, the process involves adding a small harness in series with the main SAT harness to allow you to effectively tap into the left and right audio signals that run between the SAT box and head unit. This solution

works regardless if you pay for SAT reception or not. Once the harness is

installed, simply selecting SAT as the source on the head unit and plugging in your digital device of choice is all it takes to listen to your digital library. Volume and tone controls work just like they would for SAT.



The installation is a little simpler for a convertible than a coupe, as the SAT unit in a convertible is just behind

the center glove box (behind the body colored panel between the seats. I decided to mount the aux jack towards the back of the console compartment. Ray shows the jack mounted towards the front.

So if you have been looking for an inexpensive way to allow you to play your digital music in your car – this might be just the solution you need.
